INTRODUCTION

St. Mary's school is a grade 7 - 9 school which offers French Immersion, a fee based Fine Arts Academy, and regular programming. We are located in South West Medicine Hat and have a population of 409 students. This year we are pleased that we have 89 Students registered in our fine arts programming. Students registered in this program receive specialized instruction in Art, Dance, Drama, Choral, and Band. Our French Immersion program has 25 students registered from grades 7 - 9. St. Mary's School's primary enrollment is generated from students transitioning from five Catholic elementary Schools in Medicine Hat (Mother Teresa, St. Michael's, St. Francis St. Louis, and Ecole St. John Paul II School). We are one of two feeder schools to Monsignor McCoy High School along with our sister school Notre Dame Academy


ASSURANCE

Assurance in the education system happens when community members, system stakeholders and education partners engage across five domains:

- 1. Student Growth and Achievement
- Teaching and Leading
- 3. Learning Supports
- 4. Governance
- 5. Local and Societal Context

For the purposes of this document, a domain is an area of activity where education partners have specific responsibilities that they are accountable for and provide assurance about. Fundamentally, assurance is reflected in what the public understands, perceives and knows about student growth and achievement, where the quality of the daily interaction between teacher and student is paramount. Assuring the public that the education system is successfully supporting student growth and achievement requires engagement and thoughtful action across all five domains.

Student growth and achievement is the primary purpose of the education system and is the core outcome domain for the assurance framework. The domains of Teaching and Leading, Learning Supports and Governance support and enable Student Growth and Achievement. Local and Societal Context, while a separate domain, operates across and is integrated into the others. For the purposes of description, the domains are considered discrete and separate. However, in practice, they overlap and are interconnected and interdependent, as depicted in the graphic below:



ENGAGEMENT

Parent Advisory

At St. Mary's School we have transitioned away from our traditional parent council where historically this group would have raised funds to support various initiatives throughout the school. We have found that it was becoming increasingly difficult to attract parents during the extremely busy junior high school years. We have endeavored to begin meeting with a group of parents in an advisory role. Each homeroom teacher has been asked to find a representative for this group so we could gain a wide variety of opinions. Our first two years of this format have been very successful. All meetings are conducted online via Google meets and allow for parents to attend from the comfort of their home or via an internet connected device from wherever their weeknight activities dictate (i.e. soccer practice, dance rehearsal, etc.)

Fine Arts Parent Council

St. Mary's School is fortunate to offer fine arts programming. Families are required to pay an additional programming fee to be part of our Fine Arts Academy. As such we feel it is imperative to connect with this group of parents to ensure that programming is meeting their expectations and for parents to offer further support to our programming. This group meets monthly and raises funds for the purchase of additional materials and larger projects within the Fine Arts Academy such as the piano in the Choral room, and new microphones used throughout our programming.


Survey's

Each year we endeavor to gain some additional data to further understand the successes and areas of improvement at our school. In the past we have conducted the Accountability Pillar Survey as well as an independent survey created by our school jurisdiction. We have considered the results of the survey and use this information to better prepare for the school year. We feel we are a school community that can adapt and meet the needs of our students quickly.

Service Projects

Every homeroom will have an opportunity to participate in a service project. These can be wide ranging and may include shoveling the neighborhood sidewalks after a snow storm, raising money for cancer, or assisting the women's shelter purple ribbon campaign. It is our intention that these projects are generated by the students and express the interests and concerns of our students which encourage them to engage with their community.


RESPONDING TO ACCOUNTABILITY PILLAR RESULTS

School Strategies by Measure	Indicators of Success				
Safe and Caring Schools	St. Mary's School thrives on a community of inclusion where students can feel safe attending school. Of note 82% of our students, an increase from 80% report feeling safe at school and 84 % report feeling safe on their way to and from school. 94% of our students report that their teachers are "good" or "very good".				
Student Learning Opportunities	In the past few years we have added many new option classes for our students to better meet their interests. This includes a games option, archery, cosmetology, robotics, and fitness. Additionally we are pleased that both parents and teachers feel that students can access support when they are needed in a timely manner as is indicated in the survey results.				
Student Learning Achievement	NA				
Preparation for Lifelong Learning, Citizenship, World of Work	94% of parents are satisfied or very satisfied that their students are taught knowledge, skills and attitudes necessary for learning throughout their lifetime. 85% of our parents report that their student is being encouraged to be involved in their community and 92% report that their student is encouraged to try their best. We feel these are all encouraging endorsements of the culture we are attempting to cultivate at St. Mary's School.				
Parental Involvement	We have seen an increase from 44% to 62% of parents who report being involved in "A Lot" or "Some"in the educational decisions regarding their student from the previous year. 93% of teachers are satisfied or very satisfied with the opportunity to be involved in the opportunity to be involved in decisions at our school. This indicated a concerted effort from our staff to connect with parents and value their input when making decisions regarding the students in their care. Nearly				

	70% of our Parents are satisfied or very satisfied with their opportunities to be involved in the education decisions of their students in our school.
Continuous Improvement	Students and teachers report that they feel the quality of education continues to improve at St. Mary's School. The school staff continued to provide exceptional educational experiences for our students throughout the pandemic with 93% of our staff reporting that they feel the quality of education has continued to improve or stay the same in the last three years. 83% of our students report that the quality of education has improved or stayed the same in the last three year. This is encouraging as well believe we have added many new experiences for our students and continue to evaluate our programming successes and needs every year.
